It outlines simple practices and techniques to overcome many of the barriers in daily life.

Life after hearing loss: Telling it like it is... is the second of two books featuring case studies of those with acquired hearing loss, from the initial feelings of shock and denial through to acceptance. Through personal understanding the authors, Bunty Levene and Val Tait, provide a positive and constructive approach to managing hearing loss.

Both books are recommended not only to those who are hard of hearing themselves, but also to their families and to health and social care professionals.

Research reports include: *Hidden Lives* - the psychosocial impact of acquired profound hearing loss (APHL), *Are You Being Served?*- deafened people's views and experiences of rehabilitation services, and *Lost For Words* - deafened people's views and perceptions of general public attitudes.


Useful for anyone wishing to increase their knowledge of the lives and experiences of the deafened population.
